Dear Parents and Carers,

RE: Weather Warning

There is an amber weather warning on Thursday 2nd November for very strong winds associated with Storm Ciarán. This may disrupt travel, utilities, and cause some structural damage. The met office has issued the following for 'what to expect':

- Flying debris could result in a danger to life
- Damage to buildings and homes is possible, with roofs blown off and power lines and trees brought down
- Roads, bridges and railway lines may close, with delays and cancellations to bus, train, ferry services and flights
- Power cuts could occur and affect other services, such as mobile phone coverage
- There is potential for large waves and beach material being thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties

In addition, there is a yellow weather warning for rain. Heavy rain associated with Storm Ciarán is likely to bring disruption to parts of England and Wales. The met office has issued the following for 'what to expect':

- Delays or cancellations to train and bus services are possible
- Homes and businesses could be flooded, causing damage to some buildings
- Some communities may be cut off by flooded roads
- Fast flowing or deep floodwater is possible, causing a danger to life
