RE: PSHE Drop down day - Year 9

As part of our work in PSHE year 9 will be learning about cancer in term 3 during drop down day. This work is supported by National Curriculum guidance. The lessons will cover some key facts about how young people can look after their own health, and encourage them to think sensitively and critically about the information they hear in the media.

What will the lessons entail?

The lessons will aim to help students to understand what cancer is, the signs and symptoms to be aware of, how to talk to a doctor about concerns and why they should critically evaluate all cancer stories in the media.
