# YEAR 7 DT BRIDGE STRUCTURES




In DT, our Year 7 students have started their Structures project, focusing on bridges. They're learning how bridges work, what materials they are made from, and how frames are constructed.

For homework, students are designing and building their own bridges using materials like paper, cardboard, straws and plastic. Their bridges must be at least 30cm long and no more than 15cm wide - no limit on height.

In class, students are working in teams to build wooden bridges using 6 x 60cm lengths of wood. The challenge is to create the strongest bridge that can hold the most bricks - a great way to develop teamwork and problem-solving skills.

### How Safe is WhatsApp for Children?

WhatsApp is one of the world's most popular messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people across 180 countries. It allows users to send messages, make voice and video calls, and participate in group chats. While it can be a great way to stay connected, there are concerns about its safety for children and young people.

Although WhatsApp is rated 16+, all that's needed to create an account is a phone number, making it easy for younger children to bypass age restrictions. Once one child in a group or class joins, peer pressure can lead others to follow, increasing potential risks. The NSPCC has highlighted vulnerabilities for child users, including exposure to inappropriate content, contact with strangers, and cyberbullying.

#### Celebrating Our Staff: The Heart of Bexhill Academy



### Meet Denni Holdsworth: Supporting Every Student at Bexhill Academy

At Bexhill Academy, we are proud to introduce Denni Holdsworth, our dedicated CLA (Children Looked After) Keyworker and EBSA (Emotional-Based School Avoidance) Attendance Support. Denni plays a vital role in ensuring that every student, regardless of their challenges, feels supported, valued and empowered to succeed.

A Safe Space for Children Looked After

Denni's office, known as The Hive, is a calm, welcoming space where students can work, take a break, or seek support. As the key adult for children in care, Denni works closely with foster families, social workers and virtual schools, ensuring every child's needs are met. Through learning walks, she helps tailor classroom support, ensuring students have the right environment to thrive.

Helping Students Overcome School Anxiety

For students struggling with anxiety, Denni runs a morning tutor group (8:30-9:30) in a quiet space near reception. This provides a relaxed start to the day with activities like coloring, games and light academic work. As confidence grows, students are introduced to The Hive, where they gradually reintegrate into mainstream lessons with a nurturing approach.

Supporting Families Beyond School

Denni's commitment extends beyond the classroom - she also carries out home visits, working closely with families to support students in their return to school. Her patience, care and dedication transform lives, helping students rebuild confidence and re-engage with learning.

We are incredibly fortunate to have Denni as part of our team. Her work ensures that every student, no matter their circumstances, has the opportunity to succeed at Bexhill Academy.
