Adapting quickly to the conditions, the team applied high pressure from the start, closing down the opposition as they attempted to play out from the back. Their efforts paid off within the first five minutes when a beautifully laid-off pass was met by Riley H, who calmly slotted the ball home from the edge of the box.

Bexhill continued to dominate the first half and were soon awarded a free kick. Junior O stepped up and delivered an inch-perfect 20-yard strike, leaving the St Leonards goalkeeper stranded as the ball found the bottom corner. The relentless pressure from Bexhill's attacking line led to Andy N adding to his goal tally with a well-taken tap-in.

The second half saw Bexhill playing uphill, but the defensive line, marshalled superbly by Max A and Reggie A, gave no ground. Midway through the half, Logan M, who had been finding space all game, was picked out by a perfectly weighted pass from captain Frankie S. Logan took one touch before unleashing a superb 30-yard strike into the top corner.

St Leonards never gave up, continuing to push forward, but they were repeatedly denied by Bexhill goalkeeper Jonah J, who showed excellent positioning and quick reactions to intercept every through ball. However, in the final minute, an unfortunate bounce saw the ball loop over Jonah, giving St Leonards a late consolation goal to make it 4-1.

#### Parent Forum Group Update – Thank You for Your Feedback

A huge thank you to all the parents and carers who attended our Term 3 Parent Forum Group meeting. Your input is invaluable in shaping the Academy's approach and ensuring we continue to support our students effectively.

We are pleased to share an overview of the key issues raised and the actions we have taken since our last meeting:

#### **Supporting High-Level Readers**

We are promoting participation in the 1066 Schools Book Award and expanding our Reading Buddies programme, with Year 10 students mentoring Year 7 readers. Look out for upcoming reading events, including World Book Day, author visits, Open Mic Night, and book swaps.

#### **Homework During Holidays**

In response to parent feedback, we will pause KS3 homework over Christmas and Easter holidays to allow students more quality family time.

#### **Assessments in KS3**

Assessments will continue to cover taught material while incorporating some stretch questions to encourage problem-solving and cross-curricular thinking.

#### **Consistent Achievement Points**

Staff will be reminded to award achievement points for homework more consistently.

#### **Set Changes & SEND Support**

Year 7 teams have been advised to ensure timely preparation for any set changes, with additional support for SEND students.



# PARENT FORUM GROUP UPDATE



#### **Homework on Edulink**

Steps have been taken to improve Sparx and Reading Plus homework visibility on Edulink, with Heads of Department monitoring compliance.

#### Homework Consistency (Supply Staff)

Additional guidance is being provided to ensure homework is set consistently, particularly where long-term supply teachers are in place.

#### **Parent Evening Format**

A focus group will be established, working alongside the PTA, to explore new formats for Parent Evenings, including potential core subject appointment slots.

#### **Behaviour Policy & Supply Staff**

The Trust Board is reviewing the consistent application of the Behaviour Policy among supply staff.

#### **Cricket Club for Boys**

Recent Student Voice feedback indicated low interest in a boys' cricket club, so this will be reviewed again in the future.

#### **Positive Feedback**

We were pleased to receive praise for the Year 11 Wellbeing Event and the new style of Academy Newsletter. Thank you for your support.



#### **Key Facts**


- Around 15-20% of people are neurodivergent.


# **DRAMA**







