CROSS COUNTRY





Sussex Schools' Cross Country Championships

On Tuesday, 25th February, I had the pleasure of taking 10 of our most talented Year 7 & 8 runners to the Sussex Schools' Cross Country Championships at Christ's Hospital in Horsham.

The event saw an incredibly high level of competition, with large numbers of runners taking part:

- Year 7 Girls: 2.6km (330 competitors)
- Year 7 Boys & Year 8 Girls: 3.1km (330 & 290 competitors, respectively)
- Year 8 Boys: 3.5km (270 competitors)

Despite the tough, muddy conditions, our students all ran strong and determined races, placing in the top half of their respective categories—an outstanding achievement! Several even made the top 50.

Although we are still awaiting the final official placings, a special mention goes to Bella, who we believe finished in the top 25 out of 330 Year 7 girls, just narrowly missing out on a top-20 place to represent Sussex.

A huge well done to the entire team — you all did Bexhill Academy proud! We will share the final results as soon as we receive them.

Sleep

Mobile data suggests Brits are embracing earlier bedtimes
A subtle but powerful wellness shift is sweeping across Britain, as new data reveals a nationwide preference toward earlier bedtimes and morning starts.

The trend, observed thanks to Virgin Media O2's network activity patterns, suggests that Britons are increasingly prioritising their wellbeing through altered sleep habits.

Virgin Media O2 broadband data suggests we are now going to bed 20 minutes earlier than in previous years, with network traffic consistently starting to drop off from 9.20pm. In comparison, 2020 traffic shows Brits going offline from 9.40pm.

The recent data shows that the nation is rising earlier too; 2024 morning broadband traffic began to rise rapidly from 6.20am, which is 15 minutes earlier than in 2020.

Brits are also taking control of their wellbeing through meditation, perhaps to counteract the stress of being connected to the 24-hour news cycle.

More than a third of Brits say the news is negatively impacting their mental health, but 44% have increased their mindfulness practices. In fact, almost two thirds (62%) have used their mobile phone to access mindfulness apps, and this figure rose to 88% for 18 to 24-year-olds.

As Britain embraces this collective move towards better sleep habits and regular meditation, perhaps a new dawn is breaking – one where technology and wellbeing work in harmony, helping to create a more mindful and happier nation, ready to face whatever challenges tomorrow may bring.

One of the highlights of this year will be the Diversity Day celebration. This event will showcase the rich cultural heritage of our student body through music, dance, food, and art.


Students and teachers can come together to celebrate their differences and find common ground, creating a sense of unity and belonging.

Personal Safety - Knife Crime Awareness

Recent news reports have highlighted concerns around knife crime, which can be understandably worrying for both parents and students. While Sussex remains a safe place to live, Sussex Police continue to work proactively with schools and other organisations to help keep our community safe and feeling secure.

- Understanding Knife Crime
- Knife crime includes any offence involving a knife or sharp object, such as:
- Carrying a knife without a valid reason
- Owning a banned knife
- Attempting to buy a knife if under 18
- Using a knife to threaten, injure, or fatally harm someone







An offensive weapon is defined under the Offensive Weapons Act 2019 as any item made or adapted to cause harm. It is also important to note that pepper spray is illegal in the UK, classified as a firearm under the Firearms Act 1968. Carrying a weapon for self-defence is not a valid reason in law and could have serious legal and personal consequences.

The Law on Knives in England

It is illegal to:

- Sell a knife to anyone under 18 (except a folding blade under 3 inches)
- Carry a knife in public without a valid reason
- Carry, buy, or sell a banned knife
- Use a knife in a threatening way, even if legal to own

The police have the authority to stop and search anyone suspected of carrying a knife. The maximum penalty for carrying a knife unlawfully is four years in prison and an unlimited fine. If you are present when someone else uses a knife, you could also face serious legal consequences.

Educating Our Students

At Bexhill Academy, we are committed to educating our students about the dangers and consequences of knife crime. Through PSHE lessons, we work closely with Sussex Police to challenge myths and misconceptions about carrying knives, helping young people make safer choices.





Talking to Your Child About Knife Crime

We encourage parents and carers to have open conversations with their children about knife crime and the risks involved. Here are some tips to start the discussion:

- Choose a comfortable time and place to talk.
- Reassure them they can be honest with you without fear of judgment.
- Encourage them to share their worries many young people carry knives out of fear, not intent.
- Emphasise that carrying a knife increases their risk of being harmed.
- Share your concerns openly; this can help them open up too.
- Remind them that most young people do not carry knives, and a knife does not offer protection.
- Discuss the life-changing consequences legal trouble, travel restrictions, lost opportunities, or worse, the loss of life.









Snitching vs. Reporting

Many young people fear being labelled a "snitch" if they report concerns. However, reporting crime is about keeping themselves and others safe. If a young person is worried about reporting a crime, they can do so completely anonymously through Fearless, a service from the charity Crimestoppers:

- Call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111

Fearless is not the police — no one will know who made the report, and they will not be contacted afterward.
