UNIFORM, JEWELLERY AND BASIC EQUIPMENT POLICY

Following consultation with parents/carers and the Student Council in September 2022, Bexhill Academy are currently reviewing the academy uniform policy as follows:

- 1) Review of summer uniform to identify if a summer polo shirt can be added (non-compulsory)
- 2) Purchase of school badges to offer parent/carers flexibility in the purchase of academy skirts

Supporting School Value: FOCUSED

At Bexhill Academy we have 3 main values that underpin our values in school.

- Respect
- Be Brilliant
- Be the Best You

In order to achieve our goal, it is imperative that students actively support our value of being **FOCUSED**. We are proud of our uniform. Our uniform represents our five houses and year groups which have a focus of **aspirational** universities. All students being in correct uniform demonstrates high expectations and standards.

Students and parents have been informed of the expectations for uniform and a copy appears on our website. Reminders are communicated to parents and carers to re-enforce our high expectations on uniform.

Members of the SLT along with members of our Pastoral teams will be on duty every morning to address uniform issues. Students will not be allowed in the building if they are not in correct uniform. If uniform is borrowed then a deposit will be given which will be returned at the end of the day when the uniform is handed back to students services. All deposits will be kept in the school safe. Where possible if students have incorrect uniform the Pastoral Manager team may contact home, and if appropriate students will be sent home to correct their uniform. Students can wear a coat to school, but this must be taken off when entering the building.

The Academy's uniform comprises of the following items:

School Uniform

- 1 Compulsory navy blazer with logo and maroon trim, girls and boys styles
- 2 Formal navy boys or girls school trouser (no logo)
- 3 Optional navy v-neck jumper with maroon trim
- 4 Compulsory navy tie with house colour stripe
- 5 Drop waist knife pleat skirt with logo
- 6 Formal shirt or blouse (no logo) light blue for years 7, 8, 9 & white for years 10, 11



UPDATE: PLEASE NOTE THAT YEARS 7, 8 & 9 WEAR A LIGHT BLUE SHIRT AND YEARS 10 & 11 WEAR WHITE

Uniform:

- Correct navy Trousers: no jeggings, leggings or skinny tight trousers
- Pleated Navy Bexhill pleated logo skirt
- Compulsory navy blue blazer with burgundy trim and academy
- V-Neck jumper with burgundy trim to v-neck (optional)
- Formal shirt/blouse (no logo) **light blue** for **Years 7, 8 & 9** and **white** for **Years 10 & 11**
- House tie
- PE kit: shorts, polo top, trainers
- Ankle length socks (no knee high socks permitted)
- Black or navy tights with no over the knee length allowed
- Black leather shoes (black trainers and boots are not acceptable)
- **KS3** only : a navy rucksack with Academy badge

Blazers are expected to be worn in academy building including to and from lessons.

Behaviour points will be given where uniform is incorrect and consequences will be applied through the behaviour system if uniform issues are not resolved.

JEWELLERY/MAKE UP

No jewellery should be worn to school apart from a watch and one small set of studs in the lower ear lobe. No facial piercings are allowed in school. Should a student be wearing inappropriate jewellery to school the student will be asked to remove the jewellery and this will then be taken to students services and placed in a safe for the day. This will be returned to the student at the end of the day. Repeat offenders will have their jewellery confiscated until the end of term unless parents have collected it and agreed the student will no longer wear it in school. Students will be asked to remove inappropriate make up. Behaviour points will be given.

Make-up should not be worn in Years 7 and 8 and discreet in Years 9, 10 and 11. Where it is not appropriate students will be asked to remove the make-up. Students should not wear false eye

lashes for school. False nails are not accepted at school, students will be asked to have these removed. Nail varnish can be worn, but no jewels within the nails.

Only natural hair colour is allowed for school. Extreme haircuts are not permitted.

Jewellery:

- Facial piercing to be removed when on school site
- 1 small studded earring in each ear
- No rings
- No bracelets
- False eye lashes to be removed
- False / acrylic nails to be removed due to health and safety
- No Unnatural hair colour
- No Inappropriate makeup
- No extreme haircuts

BASIC EQUIPMENT

The following basic equipment is required to support your child's learning:

- A number of black or blue pens
- Pencil case with ruler
- Pencils
- Eraser
- Coloured pencils
- Subject exercise books
- School bag: KS3 school logo bag

If students fail to have a pen in lessons teachers will log a step 1 warning with 5 step 1s leading to a 1 hour detention after school. Pens can be purchased during the day from the library before, during break/lunch or after school.
